

**Proposed Constitutional Amendments**  
**November 2018 General Election**  
**By Ballot Number**

**#1/HJR 7105** – Increases the homestead exemption by exempting the assessed valuation of homestead property greater than \$100,000 and up to \$125,000 from all levies other than school district levies.

**#2/HJR 21** – Limitations on Property Tax Assessments – Removes future repeal of constitutional provisions that limit the amount of annual increases in assessments, except for school district levies, of specified nonhomestead real property.

**#3** – Voter Control of Gambling in Florida - This amendment ensures that Florida voters shall have the exclusive right to decide whether to authorize casino gambling by requiring that in order for casino gambling to be authorized under Florida law, it must be approved by Florida voters pursuant to Article XI, Section 3 of the Florida Constitution. Affects articles X and XI. Defines casino gambling and clarifies that this amendment does not conflict with federal law regarding state/tribal compacts.

**#4** – Voter Restoration Amendment - This amendment restores the voting rights of Floridians with felony convictions after they complete all terms of their sentence including parole or probation. The amendment would not apply to those convicted of murder or sexual offenses, who would continue to be permanently barred from voting unless the Governor and Cabinet vote to restore their voting rights on a case by case basis.

**#5/HJR 7001** – Prohibits state tax or fee from being imposed or raised except through legislation approved by two thirds of each house of the legislature.

**#6/Revision 1/P 6001** – Creates constitutional rights for victims of crime throughout criminal and juvenile justice processes; requires judges and hearing officers to make independent interpretations; raises mandatory retirement age of state justice and judges from 70 to 75.

**#7/Revision 2/P 6002** – Grants mandatory payment of death benefits and waiver of certain educational expenses to survivors of first responders; requires supermajority votes of university trustees and board of governors to raise or impose fees; establishes state college system as constitutional entity.

**#8/Revision 3/P 6003**

- Imposes term limits on school board members
- Requires legislature to provide for promotion of civic literacy in all public schools
- Maintains school board's duties to public schools it establishes, but permits the state to operate, control, and supervise public schools not established by the school board

**#9/Revision 4/P 6004** – Prohibits offshore oil and gas drilling; prohibits vaping in enclosed indoor workplaces.

**#10/Revision 5/P 6005** – Retains Department of Veteran's Affairs; ensures election of local county constitutional officers; removes ability to modify terms of office/eliminate election to offices; changes legislative session dates.

**#11/Revision 6/P 6006** – Removes discriminatory language related to real property rights; deletes provision relating to criminal statutes.

**#12/Revision 7/P 6007** – Expands current restrictions on lobbying for compensation by former public officers; creates restrictions on lobbying, etc.

**#13/Revision 8/P 6008** – Ends dog racing.
